How to Purchase a 4-H Steer!

So you're interested in buying some of the best beef raised local to Fort Saskatchewan?! Come out to our Show and Sale Monday May 27th, 2024! Come early to watch the kids show their animals and see who raised the "Champion Steer". Once you have a steer picked out- or a few to watch for- head over and get yourself a bidder's number. These kids have worked hard for months, hauling buckets, forking hay and working after school and weekends to train these animals to lead, tie and be blown dry.

Here is a breakdown of what bids may look like:

Animal weight on the hoof	1300 lbs	1200 lbs	1000 lbs
Your bid per lb	\$3.00/lb	\$3.00/lb	\$3.00/lb

Next your steer will board a trailer and head for the butcher shop! The 1300lb animal will be transformed into an approximately 750 lbs hanging carcass. The 1200 lb animal will be roughly 690 lbs on the rail and the 1000 lb steer will be approximately 580 lbs.

This is when you will get to make decisions on how you want your meat prepared, thickness of steaks, how many lbs per package etc. On average all said and done cut and wrap will be roughly \$1.30/lb, ready to go into the freezer.

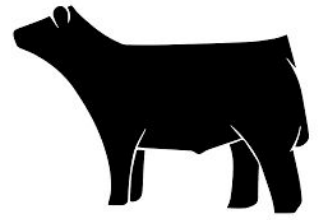
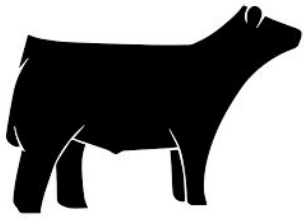
